All cables are routed within a suitable EMC protection (pipes, cables trays or trunkings).

Some commercial and institutional facilities such as large shopping malls, convention centers, office buildings, sports complex and hospitals use cable bus for its service entrance and power distribution ...

When fitting cable trays and their accessories, the products are cut on site to create changes of direction, adjust sections, etc. Damage can also occur during handling; as a result, both the ...

This article explains the main requirements and good practices for cable tray systems, including tray types, materials, loading, supports, bonding, cable selection, and installation details.

Cable tray is considered to be a system. It must provide continuous support for cables, and the electrical continuity of the cable tray system must be maintained.
