ENCLOSE meaning: 1. to surround something: 2. to send something in the same envelope or parcel as something else....

enclosed (In'kl??zd) or inclosed adj 1. completely surrounded by something, esp a wall or similar barrier

ENCLOSE definition: to shut or hem in; close in on all sides. See examples of enclose used in a sentence.

Things that are enclosed are surrounded on all sides, closed or penned in. If your grandfather's condo development is enclosed by a high fence, you might need to check in with a guard before you can ...
