



How many vertical shaft cable tray supports are there per floor

Where products of five metre lengths or above are packed in bundles, they shall be supported with a minimum of three timber bearers which provide sufficient clearance to accommodate the forks of a ...

Normal Spans: These trays must have support after every 2 or 3 meters. This will involve purchasing additional hangers and wasting more time drilling holes in the ceiling.

The design calls for four 12" cable trays vertically stacked with a concrete wall on one side. The trays are 6" apart with the bottom tray being 5"-0" above the finished floor.
