Fiber optic cable cost varies by cable type, length, and installation conditions. Buyers typically pay for cable, connectors, and labor, plus any routing or permit requirements.

Prices typically range from about \$0.60 to \$3.50 per foot for fiber optic cable and basic installation, depending on indoor vs outdoor routing, distance, and terrain.
