

Swiss switchgear wiring

I recently bought a Shelly1 and want to use it behind my switch which also has a plug. I live in Switzerland and the cabling is old. I took some pictures and made a mockup drawing. I don't ...

Fortunately, there's an easy to follow guide that can help you get your home wiring in order. The Swiss electrical wire color code is based on the European standard.

My son is a qualified Swiss electrician working in Bern. He told me not to trust the electricians' neon screwdrivers, and I pass this tip on to you free of charge.

There is a requirement in Switzerland for vertical and horizontal cable runs and this will be the case in new builds. During rebuilds there is a slightly more pragmatic approach taken, especially when ...
